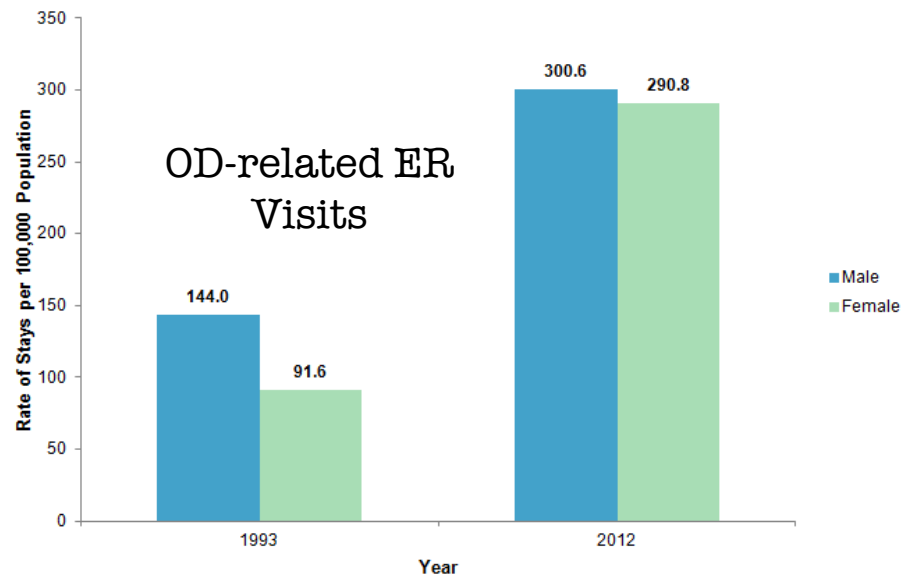
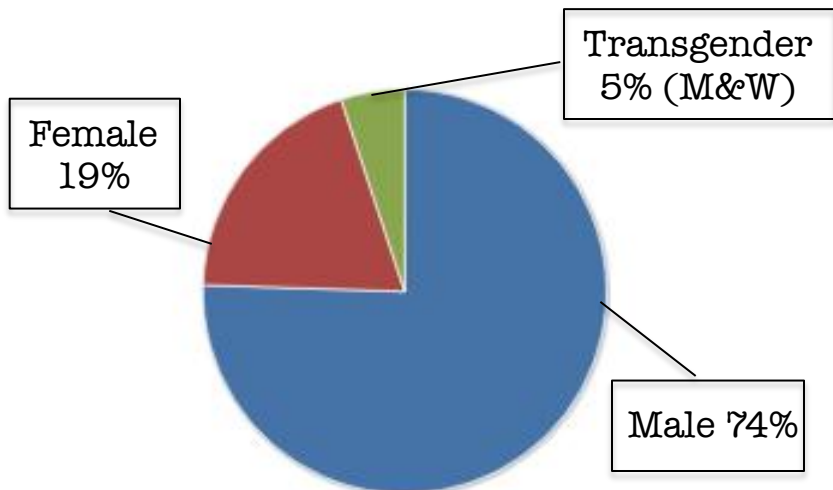


## What were we talking about at HRC 2012?

## Prevention Point Philadelphia



Since 1999, fatal ODs have risen by 265% for men, and 416% for women, who are also more likely to mix opiates with benzodiazepines.

*Women drug users and sex workers of all genders are largely excluded from harm reduction services and leadership. These communities are the future of the movement – if you believe harm reduction is about more than syringe exchange, you must help make a place for them at the table!*

- Does the under-representation of female participants at SAPs result in the lack of women's programming, or is lack of programming the cause of under-representation?
- How can we manage exclusion from traditional non-profit organizations? What would you like the decision-makers to know?
- How can we address respectability politics regarding drug use within the sex worker rights activism?
- What are the roles of allies? How can we harness institutional power and influence without losing our voices?
- How do we manage feelings of exclusion, frustration, and hurt?
