SWOP chapters have the unique position of being connected to a international sex worker campaign, while also maintaining the ability to work on local sex worker rights issues.

If you are already part of another like-minded group (COYOTE, Bayswan, PONY, Desiree Alliance, etc.), you are welcome and encouraged to work on SWOP's campaigns and serve as an SWOP affiliate for your area. We will call on you to help with national actions and lobbying, and you can still do the other work your group does at regular meetings.

If you are a part of a group that is not a SWOP affiliate, your group can still work on international, national and local SWOP campaigns. Some of the campaigns you can take part in include:

- * Decriminalization of prostitution
- * Emergency court support
- * State campaigns for prostitution law reform
- * Organize and produce events that create awareness about sex worker rights issues.

ABOUT US...

Sex Workers Outreach Project-USA is a national social justice network dedicated to the fundamental human rights of sex workers and their communities, focusing on ending violence and stigma through education and advocacy. Local chapters work to build community and make their areas safer for sex workers, their families, and friends.

Operating in one of the most prominently violent societies today, sex workers are seldom afforded protection or recourse from violent acts committed against them because of the precarious, often graft-ridden relationship between sex work and law enforcement. Society tolerates violence against sex workers because of the stigma and myths that surround prostitution. Only until these falsehoods are corrected and sex workers are legitimized will we be able to effectively prevent and minimize the structural and occupational challenges of sex work.

SWOP works to educate policy-makers and the public on the institutional harms committed against sex workers, and advocates for alternatives. We also offer toll-free telephone services for sex workers and allies seeking legal advice, court support, or information on additional sex worker resources (please call 877-776-2004 for these services).

Our first major action was to organize the first annual International Day to End Violence against Sex Workers in 2003 with the Green River Memorial to the victims of Gary Leon Ridgeway. In 2004, SWOP spearheaded a voter ballot

initiative to decriminalize prostitution in Berkeley, CA. Some of our more recent work focuses on amending so called "protective" legislation like the Trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA) of 2000 (and now its reauthorization in 2005 with the new End Demand provisions) which has increased criminal penalties and the stigma associated with sex work.

SWOP promotes proven and effective social policy approaches to the sex industry. In order to reach its goals, SWOP adopts the principles and practices of nonviolent action in order to reduce violence and achieve dignity and rights for sex workers.
